ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day, came on to be heard, the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Wayne H. Cobb, Jr. for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Appellant filed the notice of appeal on June 10, 2004. The clerk's record and the reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before July 14, 2004. The Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas ("CDC") filed the clerk's record with the Board on July 14, 2004. The reporter's record was due on or before September 19, 2004. The Appellant's brief was due on October 19, 2004. The Appellant's brief has not been filed, and Appellant has not requested an extension of time to file his brief. This Board issued an Order to Show Cause to Appellant on December 28, 2004, giving Appellant 30 days to respond and show cause as to why this appeal should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. The Appellant did not respond.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution, with prejudice to refile.
