Please file and/or take judicial notice of my full compliance with my program in Louisiana. And also the full dismissal of all criminal charges arising from the incident in question. Nothing remains open nor pending.

Additionally, please take notice (for purposes of mitigation) that before the incident, I had been prescribed Lexapro by my family doctor to help with the severe anxiety and depression I was suffering because of the break-up of my 30-year marriage (and the fact that the Lexapro had been causing me both auditory and visual hallucinations before the incident). My doctor and therapist at the Virginia 60-day program advised me that the Lexapro had "hijacked" my brain down to the basic fight-or-flight response, which was the reason for my actions. I prosected for five years, and thereafter defended criminal charges, so one can easily see that a "disconnect" between rational thoughts and actions occurred that evening. In other words, it was not an intentional thought or act on my part that happened.

My legal-representation-of-clients record has been pristine, without complaints or incidents.

Based upon the incident, I have been punished and suffered greatly already (to the point of near bankruptcy). In the past, I have performed countless pro-bono hours, and taken cases that other lawyers would not (meaning that the public was able to have competent and effective legal representation for a reasonable price). Noone has ever suffered from my legal career. And noone was hurt in my unfortunate actions of the five minutes in question that led to this unfortunate situation I now face.

Please take this into consideration as you prepare for our Zoom meeting. You are required by statute to have this hearing; but, you are not required to punish me further. No Texas resident has been harmed, nor any Louisiana resident. To continue punishment of me at this point serves no valid purpose, and certainly could not be described as justice meted out consistent with the offense.

To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is being sent to provide you with an update on Mr. Carl Duke's JLAP compliance.

Pursuant to the standard terms and conditions of Mr. Duke's five (5) year Recovery Agreement executed on December 5, 2019, he is required to: submit to random drug screens in order to demonstrate that he is remaining abstinent from alcohol and mind-altering substances; attend a minimum of three (3) mutual support meetings per week and provide a monthly meeting log to document attendance; submit a self-report on his sobriety to his JLAP case manager; meet monthly with his JLAP monitor; and, pay a \$50 monthly monitoring fee to the Judges and Lawyers Assistance Program to defray the cost of monitoring her case.

To date, Mr. Duke has been drug screened a total of 30 times and all tests have resulted negative.

Regarding his daily check-ins, Mr. Duke has missed a total of 8 out of 671.

In light of all the above and foregoing, Mr. Duke is currently in full compliance with his JLAP Recovery Agreement and appears to be working a solid recovery program.
