## **ORDER**

On this day, the Board considered the Motion to Reconsider Appellant's Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to File Appellant's Brief, filed by Appellant Cheryl D. Brown-Raines in the above-numbered and captioned evidentiary appeal on August 19, 2022. In that Motion, Appellant requests that the Board reconsider her fourth motion for extension of time to file the appellant's brief, which the Board denied by order dated August 9, 2022. That order notified Appellant that failure to file the appellant's brief by August 19, 2022 "may result in dismissal of this appeal for want of prosecution." As communicated by email to the Board, the Petitioner, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, does not agree to any further extensions. To date, Appellant still has not filed an appellant's brief.

Having considered Appellant's motion for reconsideration and the grounds cited therein, the Board **ORDERS** that Appellant's Motion to Reconsider Appellant's Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time to File Appellant's Brief is **DENIED**.

The Board further **ORDERS** that Appellant, within fourteen (14) days from the date of this order, RESPOND AND SHOW CAUSE why the appeal should not be dismissed for want of

prosecution. *See* BODA Internal Procedural Rule 4.03(a), 4.05(f), 4.09. Any late-filed brief by Appellant must include a motion for leave to file the appellant's brief.
