JUDGMENT AFFIRMING JUDGMENT OF DISBARMENT

On July 24, 2015 the Board of Disciplinary Appeals heard argument by Appellant Charles Chandler Davis and Appellee Commission for Lawyer Discipline of the State Bar of Texas in Davis' appeal from a Judgment of Disbarment signed October 2, 2014, Cause No. A0051113770, before the Evidentiary Panel 14-1 of the District 14 Grievance Committee of the State Bar of Texas. The Board has jurisdiction to hear and decide this appeal. Tex. Gov't Code § 81.0751(a)(1); Tex. Rules Disciplinary P. R. 7.08D.

The parties have both requested supplementation of the evidentiary record with documentation not part of that record. Neither party objected. Accordingly, the Board allows the supplementation as requested by each party.

The Board denies Appellee's Motion to Strike Appellant's Reply Brief.

On July 24, 2015, at the conclusion of the hearing, Appellee withdrew its request for additional briefing.

On July 27, 2015, Davis filed a letter brief with the Board responding to some questions asked during oral argument. Appellee has filed no objection and has notified the Board that it would

not respond. The Board accepts the letter brief.

Having heard the argument of counsel, and after considering the record and the briefs, the Board overrules Davis' issues and finds that the Judgment of Disbarment signed October 2, 2014 should be affirmed.

It is therefore, **ORDERED**, **ADJUDGED**, and **DECREED** that the Judgment of Disbarment, October 2, 2014, Cause No. A0051113770, be, and hereby is, **AFFIRMED** in all respects.
