ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals’ own motion to dismiss the appeal filed by Evin G. Dugas for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the Appellant filed the notice of appeal of the judgment of fully probated suspension signed on March 13, 2015 by the Evidentiary Panel 9-1 for the State Bar of Texas in case no. 201400134 on April 3, 2014. The clerk’s record and the reporter’s record from the evidentiary hearing were due to be filed on or before June 5, 2015. The Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas (“CDC”) filed the clerk’s record with the Board on April 24, 2015. The reporter’s record was not filed. The Appellant’s brief was due on July 6, 2015. The Appellant’s brief was not filed, and Appellant did not request an extension of time to file his brief.

On July 20, 2015 this Board issued its Order to Show Cause wherein the Appellant was ordered to respond and show cause as to why the cause should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. Appellant did not respond or file a brief or request an extension of time to do so.
