## RESPONDENT'S SUPPLEMENTAL MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE - OPPOSED

## TO THE BOARD OF DISCIPLINARY APPEALS:

- Petitioner files this Supplemental Motion for Continuance in response to the Petitioner's Response to Respondent's Motion for Continuance.
- 2. Petitioner asserts that the Respondent's motion for continuance is not supported because the motion was unverified or supported by an affidavit or unsworn declaration. To the contrary, exhibits 3 and 4 attached to the First Amended Disciplinary Petition states that Mr. Herring is to serve "180 days of confinement in the Harris County Jail or otherwise directed by the court beginning 03/01/2024."
- 3. Petitioner also alleges in its response that it was delayed in serving Respondent. This was due to his incarceration, which is evidenced by the Proof of Service filed in this matter showing that Respondent was served on May 15, 2024 at 701 N. San Jacinto St., Houston, TX 77002. This is the address for the Harris County Jail.
- 4. To remove any doubt, attached is an unsworn declaration by undersigned counsel under penalty of perjury pursuant to Tex. Civ. Prac. & Rem. Code Ann. § 132.001.
- 5. Petitioner also alleges that "Respondent's presence at the hearing will not change the finality of his conviction." This is not the only consideration in a compulsory discipline hearing. The Board of Disciplinary Appeals has the discretion to suspend a lawyer

convicted of a serious and/or intentional crime under Rule 8.06 of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure. Under the Board's precedent, numerous factors are considered in determining suspension rather than disbarment. *See Filippov* (BODA Case No. 30611,

Jan. 22, 2004) and Isassi (BODA Case No. 57699, May 8, 2017).

6. Respondent respectfully requests this continuance so that Respondent may adequately assist undersigned counsel in the presentation of evidence and be present at his Compulsory

Discipline hearing, which is set before his release date.

7. Respondent respectfully requests that the Board of Disciplinary Appeals continue the

hearing on Compulsory Discipline.

8. This is the first motion for continuance for extension of time filed by either Respondent or

Petitioner.

**CONCLUSION AND PRAYER** 

Respondent believes that a continuance of the hearing and rescheduling for the next quarterly meeting of the Board is warranted. The relief requested is sought not for the purpose of delay but so justice may be done.

For the foregoing reasons, Respondent respectfully requests that the Board of Disciplinary Appeals continue the hearing on this matter to the next quarterly meeting.
