ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL FOR WANT OF PROSECUTION

On this day came on to be heard the Board of Disciplinary Appeals own motion to dismiss the above appeal filed by Cary W. Schulman for want of prosecution. After reviewing the papers filed in the matter, the Board finds that the notice of appeal was filed by the Appellant on April 30, 2014. The clerk's record from the evidentiary hearing was due to be filed on or before July 22, 2014. The Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel of the State Bar of Texas filed the clerk's record with the Board on July 22, 2014. The reporter's record from the evidentiary hearing was due to be filed on or before August 22, 2014, by order dated July 30, 2014. It has not been filed nor has the Appellant requested a further extension of time to file the reporter's record. Appellant's brief, which was due to be filed on September 22, 2014, has not been filed, and Appellant did not request an extension of time to file his brief.

On December 4, 2014 this Board issued its Order to Show Cause wherein the Appellant was ordered to respond and show cause as to why the cause should not be dismissed for want of prosecution. Appellant did not respond or file a brief or request an extension of time to do so.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that this appeal is hereby **DISMISSED** for want of prosecution with prejudice to refile.
