FIRST AMENDED ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE ON PETITION FOR RECIPROCAL DISCIPLINE AND HEARING NOTICE

Pursuant to Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure ("TRDP") Part IX, the Commission for Lawyer Discipline, Petitioner, filed its First Amended Petition for Reciprocal Discipline against Respondent Aaron Mark Wesbrooks on February 8, 2022. The Petition states that on or about June 29, 2021, the Presiding Disciplinary Judge of the Supreme Court of Arizona issued a final judgment and order in the case styled *In the Matter of a Member of the State Bar of Arizona, Mark Doss Wesbrooks, Bar No. 018690*, PDJ 2020-9097, State Bar Nos. 19-2602 and 20-2347, reprimanding Respondent in accordance with consent documents, and ordering that Respondent be placed on probation, subject to specified terms, for a period of one (1) year. A true and correct copy of the First Amended Petition for Reciprocal Discipline, which includes that final judgment and order, is attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes as if set forth in full.

It is, therefore, **ORDERED** that Respondent Aaron Mark Wesbrooks shall, within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this First Amended Order to Show Cause on Petition for Reciprocal Discipline, show cause why the imposition of identical discipline, to the extent practicable, in Texas by the Board of Disciplinary Appeals pursuant to Texas Rule of Disciplinary Procedure 9.02, would be unwarranted. Respondent should consult Part IX of the Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure regarding the failure to file an answer. Failure to file a timely answer may waive Respondent's right to raise the defenses set forth in Texas Rule of Disciplinary Procedure 9.04 and limit the scope of the hearing to exclude presentation of any such defenses. *See* Tex.

It is further **ORDERED** that this matter is set for hearing before the Board on Friday, April 29, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. in the courtroom of the Supreme Court of Texas, Austin, Texas. The hearing location and format (in-person vs virtual) are subject to change based on conditions related to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Board of Disciplinary Appeals will notify the parties of any changes to the hearing location or format.
